TEACHING EXPERTISE

I have taught Introduction to 4D Studio Art three times, covering technical, formal, and historical concerns relating to sequential art, performance art, sound art, film, and web art. I have also taught a foundations course covering 2D and 3D techniques such as drawing, painting, collage, printmaking, and book arts. Additionally, I have extensive experience with digital and darkroom photography, Adobe CS6 and CC, and the principles and practice of graphic design. I have limited experience with XHTML, CSS, and ActionScript (Adobe Flash).

I am qualified to teach advanced techniques in lithography, intaglio, relief, and serigraphy, including traditional and experimental approaches. I have led demonstrations in stone lithography, monotype, relief printmaking, sculptural printmaking, and bookmaking. I am also prepared to teach 2D, 3D, and 4D foundations classes which address technical, formal, historical, and conceptual concerns in equal measure.
